Property News

Did you notice!?!? Over the summer much work was done around the property.

- ❖ Repair of some of the mortar on the south side of the church that was causing moisture seeping into the church and the peeling of the paint on the south wall.
- ❖ Painting of the South, West and North interior walls of the church.
- ❖ New iron railing on the rear ramp to the offices to replace the one destroyed by vandals.
- ❖ New flower plantings and landscaping of the Memorial Burial Garden.
- ❖ Excavation of the two drains outside of the parish hall door and connecting these drains to the storm drain pipes of the city.
- ❖ Considerable long deferred maintenance and tuning of the organ was accomplished.
- ❖ The city removed the brick walkway in front of the church and replaced it with a new cement/brick sidewalk. They also elevated the church’s brick walkways so that they are level with the new sidewalk.

Hospital Info

Please remember to inform the office if you go to the hospital for whatever reason for however long! St. Joseph's will not inform us any more of people registering as Episcopalians, and your religious preferences do not get registered at SNHMC if you are admitted through the Emergency Room. Help us help you – let us know!



Recommended Response

There are times on Main Street (or other places) when you may be confronted by someone asking for money. For several reasons we recommend that you do NOT give them any money. You cannot be sure what the money you give will be used for and it may in fact only go to aid an addiction. The better response is to refer them to the Front Door 886-2866 (Formerly Nashua Pastoral Care Center), where they will receive comprehensive help and be screened for their appropriate level of need. If you feel strongly compelled to help, only help with food, by offering to take them to a food establishment and then pay the establishment for the meal. Also remember that 10 cents of every dollar you donate to CGS gets passed on to the Front Door to help those in need by staff trained to respond appropriately.

HELP TD BANK DONATE TO CGS: TD Bank will make an annual contribution (from the bank's funds) to the church based on a percentage of the balances in personal and business accounts of parishioners. You can help by 1) Going to your TD Bank, inform them that you would like your TD Bank accounts labeled for Church of the Good Shepherd Affinity Program. 2) Contact Laurie at the office to let us know you have done this so that our records match their records.) Those without TD Bank accounts who desire to participate can do so by opening an account there. CGS will not receive any account info or personal info about your accounts or balances.

THANK YOU FOR HELPING CGS SAVE ALMOST \$2,000 PER YEAR!
