WALKING IN THE LIGHT

"Walking in the Light" is a program of spiritual renewal and growth. The words "spiritual renewal and growth" typically conjure up negative fundamentalist images to Episcopalians. "Walking in the Light", while led by people with great charisma, is non-charismatic in its style. The program is based upon the biblical model of the disciples sitting together with Jesus around a meal, asking questions, and being inspired by Jesus' presence and his responses to the questions, learning how to better live their lives in relationship to God.

Each Day Mon. Oct 31 – Thurs Nov 3 will feature each of the leaders speaking at a breakfast, lunch and dinner seminar. Each of those evenings will feature a service with one of the leaders preaching, followed by discussion groups led by the leaders.

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY

The EFM Program is an advanced study of Christianity. Participants study the Old and New Testaments, church history, and twentyfirst century theology. Students make a commitment to this 4-year program one year at a time. The group usually meets once a week during a nine-month academic cycle. Lesson and study guides are provided for the students to read each week. There is a tuition fee for the academic cycle, and some funding support is available if tuition is a hardship. EFM teaches a person how to think theologically and deepens one's faith and understanding of our Christian heritage. Course to begin Fall 2016. INQUIRERS CLASS
