The Communion of the People

All persons who accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior are welcome to share in the Bread and Wine of Communion, regardless of denominational background. Come to the rail at the direction of the ushers. Stand or kneel at the rail and receive the bread (a wafer) in the palm of your hand. Receive the wine either by drinking from the cup (guiding it to your lips) or by touching the wafer, which you have retained, lightly to the wine. If you decide not to receive the Bread and/or the Wine and would prefer a blessing on your behalf, simply cross your arms over your chest.

An Important Note: As we Journey towards the Cross of Jesus this Holy Week, we should also be aware how among Jews and Muslims the cross has evoked and still evokes memories of the murderous Christian Crusades. In not too distant times, it was actually during Holy Week that Jews suffered the worst pogroms. Even today images linger in our minds of the high priests - not to mention Judas - as looking much more Jewish than Jesus. How can that be? Were they not all Jews? Such simple questions should make us resolve to purge our Holy Week worship of all its potential contempt for Jews and Judaism. We do so in a spirit of repentance, shamefully aware of how our story of reconciliation often was turned into its very opposite and with renewed dedication to ending religious violence and persecution around the world. Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

Lenten Altar Decorations: This year’s Lenten Altar combines the Legend of the Dogwood and a celebrated part of the festival of Easter, the Last Supper (communion) and CGS constant display of its elements in our Altar Rail and kneelers. Lent this season on the High Altar you will find these elements: The vines, grapes and leaves of our communion wine- the blood of Christ; The wheat of our communion bread- the body of Christ; The strong straight wood of the cross of the crucifixion; The twisted slender branches of the dogwood of today with its blossoms.
